What is Boston Children Thrive in 5?

Boston Children Thrive in 5: Connecting Families, Building Community is a neighborhood-based effort to bring the entire community together to support young children by supporting parents and caregivers in their role as their child’s first teacher.

Boston Children Thrive in 5 is unique in that it builds on the everyday relationships and routines that families have in their neighborhood. It engages all members of the community to offer early childhood information and resources everywhere parents go – from the supermarket to the health center, the bodega to the church, the hair salon to the bank.

Boston Children Thrive in 5 neighborhoods create:

- ☞ “No wrong door” for families in need of services by improving the way agencies work together, increasing referrals and follow up for families.
- ☞ More opportunities for families to engage in positive adult-child interactions, focused on learning, in the places they go on a regular basis.
- ☞ Multiple ways families of young children can get information about the programs, events and supports available to them through people they trust.
- ☞ Expanded and enhanced supports for families with young children based on the community’s strengths and needs.

Where is Boston Children Thrive in 5?

Boston Children Thrive in 5 is currently being implemented in 5 neighborhoods. In each neighborhood there is an organization called a “hub agency” that is leading and coordinating this effort. Each of these hub agencies is working in collaboration with many community partners.
